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GUIDELINES TO ACCESSING TREATMENT

Accessing alcohol/drug treatment services in the metropolitan St. Louis Area (St. Louis City and the counties of St. Louis, Jefferson, Franklin, St. Charles, Lincoln and Warren) had become increasingly complex due to changes in state systems and the advent of managed care. The instructions below offer the best information to date on how to access treatment in our area.

NOTE TO FAMILIES: For specialized services and self-help programs for family members and significant others who have been affected by another person's alcohol/drug problem, please call the NCADA for a referral.

PLEASE READ THIS ENTIRE SECTION BEFORE ACCESSING TREATMENT.

1. **If you have insurance** (adult or adolescent):
Call your insurance carrier to discuss the extent of your coverage for alcohol/drug addiction and how to access treatment through their network.
2. **If your insurance does not cover addiction or your benefits have been depleted and you have the means to pay for treatment** (adult or adolescent):
Call any treatment program listed in this manual for admitting procedures or call the NCADA for a referral to a private practitioner. Some programs may offer a payment plan.
3. **If you do not have insurance (or your benefits have been depleted) and you do not have the means to pay for treatment and:**
 - a) **You live in St. Louis City or St. Louis County and you are a service veteran:**
You must visit in person the Veterans Affairs Medical Center at the John Cochran facility, 894-6652, to access treatment at their facilities.
 - b) **You are an adult:**
You must call one of the state-funded programs directly for access to the program (contingent on space availability), or call NCADA for a referral.
 - c) **You are an adolescent (13-17) anywhere in the metropolitan area:**
You must call a state-funded adolescent program or an out-of-state state-funded program directly for access to treatment (contingent on space availability). Call the NCADA for an out-of-state referral.
4. **If you are a MEDICAID RECIPIENT you can directly access treatment at any of the local C-STAR agencies:**

SCORING

A YES answer to any one question indicates the strong possibility of alcoholism or other drug addiction in your family.

CO-OCCURRING DISORDERS

Studies have indicated that about half of all persons with serious mental illnesses have had a substance use disorder at some time in their lives; about one-third of them have a current substance use disorder. With the National Institute of Mental Health estimating that 5.5 million persons in the United States are disabled by severe mental illness in any given year, the portion of that population with co-occurring substance use disorder would appear to be somewhere around 1.8 million persons.

The National Comorbidity Survey, which includes any category of psychiatric illness along with a substance use disorder, puts the total number of persons with co-occurring disorders between 7 million and 9.9 million, depending on one's definition of alcohol abuse. This survey, however, only includes persons in households. The total does not include the homeless or prison inmates.

Of all persons with serious mental illness who are involved in the criminal justice system, 70 to 75 percent also have a substance abuse problem. About 500,000 persons in the nation's criminal justice system, or about 10 percent of the overall criminal justice population, have co-occurring substance abuse and mental health disorders. More than twice as many women as men in jails and prisons have serious mental illnesses. About 80 percent of these women have co-occurring substance abuse.

Complicating the numbers further is the lack of valid assessment instruments. Because substance abuse affects persons with severe mental illness differently than it does the general population, traditional instruments do not work. Substance abuse produces greater long-term negative effects, such as increased hallucinations and suicidal thoughts. And because less of a substance produces a greater effect in persons with serious mental illness, these individuals rarely develop physical dependence.

The consequences of substance abuse also differ from those for the general population. Rather than experiencing problems with jobs, spouses, and the ability to drive persons with co-occurring disorders often face problems managing their mental illness, complying with medication schedules, and maintaining housing. And because persons with co-occurring disorders often are confused about why they use alcohol or drugs, they feel little need for treatment.

The bottom line:

Clients in the mental health system must receive a thorough assessment for a substance use disorder; and clients in the alcohol/drug system must receive a thorough assessment for a mental illness. Failure to treat both disorders concurrently can lead to relapses and exacerbate the problems.
